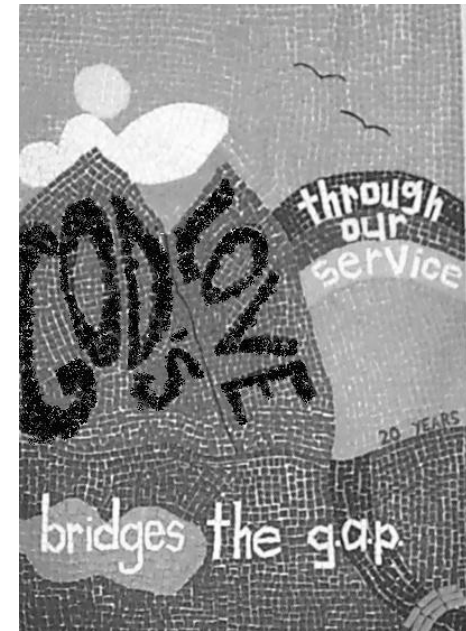

GREETINGS FROM GAP

The Gainesville Aid Project is an opportunity for Christian fellowship, as well as service. It is a program attended by church groups from all over the state of Georgia, in which youth become involved in ministering to persons in need.

We would like to invite your group to participate in GAP this year. Because GAP is a ministry designed for small groups, please limit your number of individuals to a maximum of 25, including drivers.

The typical GAP day begins in the setting of rustic Antioch Campground. After a hardy breakfast, teams of workers go out into the community to fulfill their assigned tasks.

Work assignments are coordinated to include not only physical labor but also a time of sharing fellowship between teams and those who are being served.

Work teams usually return to the campground early in the afternoon to enjoy a time of recreation and fellowship together.

After dinner and group-building activities, the day ends with a beautiful candlelight worship service and a time of sharing.

The GAP program affords your group the opportunity to make new friends, as well as strengthen old friendships in the context of a Christian community. Not only will you be serving others, but you will be discovering the satisfaction received from giving unselfishly.

The Gainesville Aid Project is open to anyone entering the 7th grade and above. Space is limited, so return your registration with accurate numbers of participants by February 1, 2009.

When we have received your registration and deposit, we will forward to you additional information, including what campers should bring, as well as general information about what to expect.

The cost of the weekend is \$80 for each person. This amount includes meals, lodging, and T-shirt.

A \$40.00 non-refundable registration fee for EACH GAPPER must accompany this form with the balance due on April 1, 2009.

Each group should bring one reliable adult driver 21 years of age or older (with a vehicle) for each 5 campers. Drivers may come free of charge and a T-shirt may be purchased for \$10.
